INTERNATIONAL FINE ART PHOTOGRAPHY EXHIBIT OPENS AT DENVER INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

A unique collection of international fine art photography is being exhibited at Denver International Airport (DIA) in its prominent Bridge Gallery, between the Terminal and Concourse A. Beginning September 15, The Center for Fine Art Photography is presenting an impressive collection of fifty-one images from established and emerging photographers throughout the world. Varying from traditional black and white film to digitally altered creations, this remarkable exhibit features selected images from a series of juried shows hosted by the Center earlier this year.

This first of four DIA exhibitions includes a display of the evolution of still photography. A succession of prints beginning with one of the earliest 1839 Daguerreotype and many print examples leading to inkjet prints, including: metallic tintypes, cyanotypes, pinhole, Polaroid transfers and hand colored prints. Additionally, a timeline of cameras from early Kodak™ box cameras to today's digital camera is presented.

The Bridge Gallery connects DIA's Terminal to Concourse A on the mezzanine level. The gallery is open 24 hours a day and does not require passing through security screening. It is estimated that over 25 thousand people a *day* will view the exhibition that continues through January 8, 2007.

The Center for Fine Art Photography is a non-profit arts organization located in Fort Collins, Colorado. Located in the Museum of Contemporary Art building in historic Old Town, the Center is well known on the world wide web.
