The Center for Fine Art Photography presents its newest exhibition of fine art photography, ***Our Environment; the Good, the Bad and the Ugly***. This exhibition is on display in the Center's gallery from November 7 through November 26, 2008.



Our Environment; the Good, the Bad and the Ugly, tells a story of the effect of the human foot print. The exhibition features works from artists who consider themselves nature conservationists as well as photographers with a conscience. Robert Glenn Ketchum, Juror, is an advocate for world-wide conservation issues and is the leading environmental photographer. His photography and writings have focused public attention on complex issues of environmental politics and have been presented to Congress and other world leaders.

Forty-seven photographers representing Canada, Great Britain, India, Switzerland, Thailand and the United States are exhibiting their work in the Center's gallery. The artists' and public reception is from 6-9 pm on Friday November 7, during the Fort Collins Gallery Walk.

The Center for Fine Art Photography is a non-profit organization whose mission is to promote the *art* of photography, showcase the work of leading and emerging photographers, and to educate the public about the collectable value of photographic art.
