This special exhibition showcases approximately 70 images taken by 52 current or former Peace Corps volunteers. From Afghanistan to Zimbabwe, these images were captured all over the world. This exhibition will be on display in the Center's gallery from August 20 – 30, 2008.

A special reception for Peace Corps Volunteers attending the Beet Street sponsored reunion will be at the Center on Friday August 22, 2008 from 3-6 pm. Exhibiting artists and Dr. Anthony Bannon will also be attending.

Dr. Anthony Bannon, director of the George Eastman House, founded by the Eastman Kodak

Company, selected the images for the Peace Corps Exhibition. Dr. Bannon is an exceptionally knowledgeable and engaging ambassador of the art of photography. Dr. Bannon will also be present at the invitational Preview Reception on Thursday, August 21, 2008 from 6-9pm. At both receptions he will discuss his image selection process for the exhibition. He will also be available to answer questions about the role of photography as an art form and a means of communicating cultural awareness.

Gallery hours for this special exhibition are 10am-9pm, August 21-24; and from 10am-5pm, August 25-30. Admission free.
